The Emergency Broadband Benefit [Emergency Broadband Benefit | Federal Communications Commission \(fcc.gov\)](https://www.fcc.gov/emergency-broadband-benefit)

Provides a discount of up to \$50 per month towards broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase price.

Project 10Million's [Direct to Parent/Guardian program](#) provides internet access to eligible families that have a student enrolled in the National School Lunch program. Approved families receive 100GB of mobile data per year for 5 years and a FREE mobile hotspot, plus the opportunity to purchase devices at a low cost.

- New and existing T-Mobile (including Metro by T-Mobile and Sprint) as well as Non-T-Mobile customers are eligible to apply.
- Available to residents of the United States and Puerto Rico.
- One free T-Mobile hotspot device and 100GB/year data line per household, max one per student.
- Data service ends when allotment is reached until the yearly renewal date (Additional data passes are available for purchase).
- May purchase up to five select, at-cost Wi-Fi-only tablets and laptops for use with the hotspot device.

Comcast – Free for 60 days due to coronavirus for qualifying families

- Anyone who signs up for Internet Essentials will receive two free months of Internet service. We are also increasing the speed of the program to 25 Mbps downloads, and 3 Mbps uploads for all new and existing customers.
- After first two free months expire, you can either cancel the service (which you can do at any time) or keep it as a regular paying Internet Essentials customer. You will receive an easy to use self-install-kit that includes a cable modem (to receive service at your home) with a WiFi router (to connect your devices without wires). There is no term contract or credit check and no shipping fee for equipment.



AT&T - offers **low-cost wireline home Internet service** to qualifying households:

- With at least one resident who participates in the U.S. Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and
- With an address in AT&T's 21-state service area, at which we offer [wireline home Internet service](#), and

Cobb County Public Library - The library “Connect Cobb” program allows patrons to checkout the Internet to residents. These hotspots can be taken home for one week and enable patrons to attach their devices over Wi-Fi to the internet. <http://www.cobbcat.org/using-the-library/connecting-cobb-checkout-the-internet/>

- Hotspots checkout for 7 days.
- Residents in Cobb County who are authorized to access the internet with their library cards can checkout hotspots.
- Overdue fines are \$1/day. Hotspots are not renewable.
- Connect up to 10 devices at a time. (Share with your friends and neighbors!)
- Up to 12mbps of download speed.
- 6 hours of battery life before recharge.
